## **BADEN-POWELL**

#### TWO LIVES OF A HERO

TODAY, LORD ROBERT BADEN-POWELL IS KNOWN WORLD-WIDE AS THE FOUNDER OF SCOUTING. IN 1900, HOWEVER, HE WAS THE MOST FAMOUS HERO OF ENGLAND! THIS IS THE STORY OF THE "TWO LIVES OF A HERO" -- THE LIFE OF A SOLDIER FOLLOWED BY HIS LIFE AS THE "FOUNDER OF SCOUTING."

BADEN-POWELL'S FIRST LIFE, ENDING AS THE "HERO OF MAFEKING," COVERS THE PERIOD FROM HIS BIRTH IN LONDON, ENGLAND ON FEBRUARY 22, 1857, THROUGH HIS RETIREMENT FROM THE MILITARY. SHOWN ARE SOME HIGHLIGHTS OF HIS CHILDHOOD, WHERE THE NAME B-P CAME FROM, PLUS HIS EARLY MILITARY CAREER. PARTICULAR EMPHASIS IS PLACED ON THE SIEGE OF MAFEKING IN 1899-1900 WHERE HE EARNED EVERLASTING FAME BOTH AS A MILITARY HERO AND PHILATELICALLY FOR THE BADEN-POWELL HEAD STAMPS. THE FIRST LIFE OF A HERO CLOSES WITH HIS DUTY AS INSPECTOR GENERAL OF THE CAVALRY.

IN 1907, BADEN-POWELL HELD A TRIAL CAMP FOR YOUNG BOYS AT BROWNSEA ISLAND. FROM THIS INAUSPICIOUS START, THE GREATEST YOUTH MOVEMENT IN THE WORLD, SCOUTING, DEVELOPED. BADEN-POWELL'S SECOND LIFE, THEREFORE, IS AS THE "FOUNDER OF SCOUTING." HIGHLIGHTS OF HIS SECOND LIFE, FROM SCOUTING'S TINY BEGINNING, THE FOUNDING OF THE GIRL GUIDES (SCOUTS IN SOME COUNTRIES), THE DEVELOPMENT OF SCOUTING SYMBOLS AND TRAINING, THE NAMING OF BADEN-POWELL AS CHIEF SCOUT OF THE WORLD, AND HIS CEASELESS EFFORTS TO HELP OTHERS AND PROMOTE WORLD SCOUTING ARE ALL SHOWN PHILATELICALLY. INCLUDED ARE WORLD JAMBOREES, WORLD-WIDE TRIPS, AND OTHER EARLY SCOUT LEADERS.

A SPECIAL PART OF HIS SECOND LIFE WAS HIS MARRIAGE, AT AGE 55, TO OLAVE ST. CLAIR SOAMES. SHE BECAME HIS CONSTANT COMPANION IN THEIR WORLD-WIDE TRIPS AND BECAME FAMOUS IN HER OWN RIGHT AS THE WORLD CHIEF GUIDE. THEY RETIRED TO KENYA WHERE HIS SECOND LIFE, AS "FOUNDER OF SCOUTING," CLOSED WITH HIS DEATH ON JANUARY 8, 1941.

THIS PHILATELIC TRIBUTE TO LORD BADEN-POWELL IN "BADEN-POWELL - THE TWO LIVES OF A HERO," INCLUDES THE BADEN-POWELL HEAD STAMPS AND BICYCLE STAMP FROM THE SIEGE OF MAFEKING, MAFEKING COVERS, BADEN-POWELL NOTES AND LETTERS, ROCKET MAIL, MAXIMUM CARDS, POST CARDS, SPECIAL POSTAL CANCELLATIONS, SLOGAN METERS, SOUVENIR SHEETS, GUTTER PAIRS, SPECIMEN OVERPRINTS, ERRORS, ETC.

The theme of this exhibit is based upon the official biography of Lord Baden-Powell, *Baden-Powell -- The Two Lives of a Hero*, by William Hillcourt, with Olave, Lady Baden-Powell.



## Baden-Powell, a son of Henrietta Grace Smyth and Professor Baden Powell, was born February 22, 1857, near Hyde Park in London, England.








The 25 cts stamp gives the years for the centenary of Baden-Powell as **1856-1956** instead of **1857-1957**.




Baden-Powell's father, Baden Powell, died in 1860. To honor her late husband, Henrietta Powell endeavored to legally change the family name to Baden-Powell. This was done in 1869. Thereafter, Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell was known as "B-P."


He became an expert horseman and polo player.



The British suffered a disastrous defeat at Maiwand, Afghanistan in 1879. B-P was assigned to investigate causes in 1880.



In 1883 he won the Kadir Cup for pigsticking, a dangerous form of wild boar hunting. B-P considered himself to be quite an actor. At Kandahar, Afghanistan in 1881, he starred as the Major General in Gilbert and Sullivan's <u>The Pirates of Penzance</u>, while wearing the borrowed full dress uniform of a visiting British general.

B-P started the first of several tours in Africa in 1884. He quickly gained fame as a hunter and tracker. Among wild game he hunted were the springbok, kudu, and hippopotamus.



B-P considered kudu horn as a most attractive trophy.

His technique in hippopotamus hunting gained him nickname of M'hlalapanzi -- 'the man who lies down to shoot.'



B-P was stationed at Malta from 1890-1893. While there he traveled throughout the Mediterranean area combining sightseeing and spying.



He posed as an entomologist, "butterfly catcher" to spy on Austrian-controlled Dalmation coast.

He painted "Athens at Dawn" while on a sightseeing trip to Greece.



B-P spent additional time in Africa. In 1895-6, he led Ashanti Expedition in Gold Coast.

Natives communicated with drums



He was associated with or acquainted with many influential English leaders.



Among these was Cecil John Rhodes,Prime Minister of Cape Colony, and empire builder. Rhodes helped negotiate peace after Matabeleland Uprising.





B-P knew Dr. Leander Starr Jameson, a Rhodes crony, and leader of ill-fated Jameson Raid in January 1896.

Winston Spencer Churchill and B-P first met in India in 1898. Churchill was war correspondent during Boer War and obtained his exclusinve interview with B-P after Mafeking.






General Charles Warren, leader of British expedition to Bechuanaland in 1884-1885. Negotiated settlement with Transvaal. Laid out a town in 1885 which became railroad junction. This town was called Mafeking, or Mafikeng, by the natives.



B-P knew most of the Boer leaders.





Jan Christian Smuts, later South African Prime Minister. Helped B-P with Scouting in 1920s. When the Boer War broke out in South Africa in 1899, Lt. Col. Baden-Powell was ordered to defend a railroad junction called Mafeking.

On October 13, 1899 he was surrounded and the Siege of Mafeking had begun.

Soon the stamp supply started running low so all available stamps were overprinted "Mafeking Besieged" for local use. Some examples are shown.





Mourning cover from brother to sister. Posted March 25, 1900, in Saguache, Colorado and received in Ledburg, England on April 10, 1900.

Part of letter (reduced below) talks about Boer War and comments, "What a jocular man Baden Powell seems to be."

Since Lord Hobests & Kitchener have jone to africa the Boers do not seem to be having such a Prince of it, but from what the papers out here say there seems to be a chance for complications 17th some of the European powers. I received the London Post & was very glad to get in English version of the war news, How splendidly the men seein to have behave it what a socular man Baken Powell seems to be I see Charlie's old regiment the 5 Lancers were in the hottest of the fighting I should have liked to have a crack at the farmers, I hope Roger pros fins Exam b. K. please give him my love & say if he cares I will write to him with kind love to all - I remain. a. of B. One some I nope Edie & Evelyn are Enjoying their hip Wraan. Daso.

Postal service from the besieged town was by means of native runner. As risks were high, the rates were set at 1/- per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz to the north via Bulawayo and 6d to the south via Kimberley.

This cover was routed "Via the North" franked by block of four 3d overprints tied by Mafeking c.d.s. of April 9th, Crocodile Pools transit of the 15th, Bulawayo of the 23rd, and arrived in London on May 25th.

Six 1d overprints on piece paying the rate to the "South" via Kimberley. Postmarked March 28, 1900.

6d overprint on a front to England, tied by Mafeking c.d.s. dated March 29, 1900 (with another alongside), and with Kimberley squared circle receiving strike dated May 22. Cover repaired.



When the stamp supply ran out, B-P's staff decided to print stamps for use on local mail. One of the stamps honored the Cadet Corps, a group of boys organized to run errands and deliver mail.

Printed in sheets of 12 using a "blueprint" method called the ferroprussiate process. Length of exposure varied from plate to plate resulting in color variations as shown in the above stamps. Cadet Sgt. Major Warner Goodyear, 15, leader of Cadet Corps is shown. Years later, B-P referred to Goodyear as his first "Scout."

The first stamp issued pictured Baden-Powell. The stamp was prepared without B-P's knowledge or approval. It was meant only for local mail and to help morale, but a few letters were smuggled through Boer lines by native runners.








It was noted that the Baden-Powell stamp which was issued in an 18mm size did not show detail well. Production was stopped and the 18mm stamp was replaced by a 21mm stamp. Only 3,036 were issued.





Apparently, one of the plates was dropped and cracked or broken but remained in use resulting in the "cracked plate" variety.






On May 17, 1900 the Siege of Mafeking was lifted. The other BP, the British Public, desperate for good news from the Boer War, went wild. "B-P" was the most famous hero of the times.







In June 1900, at age 43, B-P was promoted to Major General, the youngest in the Army.

Baden-Powell was asked to form a police force for controlling and protecting South Africa internally once the Boer War was over. He started this task in the fall of 1900, formed the South African Constabulary of 10,000 men, and led it until March 1903.

In March 1903, Baden-Powell became Inspector General of the Calvalry. During his tenure, he was responsible for many improvements. His intelligence-gathering work led to the establishment of the Intelligence Corps.


He finished his tour in 1907. He was promoted to Lieutenant General and placed in Reserve pending retirement. At age 50, the first life of a Hero was over.



Sir William Smith

Baden-Powell's second life started because of criticism and a challenge. In 1903, William Smith, founder of the Boys' Brigade, invited B-P to a rally at Prince Albert Hall in London. When B-P was critical, he was challenged to do better -- perhaps through a boys' version of his <u>Aids</u> to Scouting.





### B-P at Brownsea Island



To test his theories on "Boy Scouting," Baden-Powell organized the first Scout camp at Brownsea Island from 1-8 August, 1907. In attendance were 21 boys plus B-P's nephew Donald. The camp was a success. The world Scouting movement was born.


Sketch of first Scout camp at Brownsea Island. Also depicted are scenes of Nauru Scouts on way to the First Australian Jamboree in 1935.







Almost immediately, girls were clamoring to become Scouts. Baden-Powell, in 1910, set up a girls' group he called Girl Guides under leadership of his sister, Agnes. Girl Guides spread quickly throughout the British Commonwealth.

B-P met a wealthy American widow in 1911. Juliette Gordon Low was living in England with no goals in life. He encouraged her to do something worthwhile. She returned to Savannah, Georgia and started the Girl Scouts of the USA on March 12, 1912.

Younger boys also wanted to be part of Scouting, so B-P organized the Wolf Cubs in 1916. He borrowed heavily from author Rudyard Kipling's <u>Jungle Books</u>.




Cover canceled at the Fourth Latvian Guide and Scout Jamboree in 1982. A special guest was Mrs. Betty Baden-Powell Clay, the Baden-Powell's younger daughter.



In 1919, the Baden-Powell's bought a new home and named it Pax Hill. They lived here until moving to Kenya in October 1938.

Lord and Lady Baden-Powell were very careful to remember their friends. In December 1928, they sent out a season's greeting with "The Moral of the Acorn and the Oak."





Olave became Chief Guide of the World in 1930. She traveled world-wide in that capacity. E.g., in 1955 she opened new Guide Headquarters on Isle of Man.



During her travels Olave attended the 7th National Jamboree of the Boy Scouts of America in 1969. While there, she was the guest of honor at the 10th International Get-together of the Scouts on Stamps Society International.



She remained Chief World Guide until her death on June 26, 1977, at the age of 88.

This set of St. Vincent stamps was printed before her death as seen on the SPECIMEN overprint. Upon her death, the years she was Chief World Guide, 1930-1977, were added.

Design of souvenir sheet and cancellation based on B-P sketch




Scouting needed permanent home for training camps, etc. so Gilwell Park at Chingford, near London, was donated. When B-P was made a Lord in 1929, he selected name Gilwell, thus becoming Lord Baden-Powell of Gilwell.


BADEN-POWELL'S FAREWELL TO SCOUTING

"The time has come for me to say good-bye. You know that many of us will never meet again in this world. I am in my eighty-first year and am nearing the end of my life. Most of you are at the beginning, and I want your lives to be happy and successful. You can make them so by doing your best to carry out the Scout Law all your days, whatever your station and wherever you are.

I want you all to preserve the badge of the Jamboree on your uniform. It will be a reminder of the happy times you have had here in camp; it will remind you to take the ten points of the Scout Law as your guide in life; and it will remind you of many friends to whom you have held out the hand of friendship and so helped through good will to bring about God's reign of peace among men. Now good-bye. God bless you all!"

(July 31, 1937. Fifth World Jamboree, Vogelenzang, Holland.)

Lord and Lady Baden-Powell retired to the Outspan, Nyeri, Kenya in October 1938 and moved into cottage called Paxtu. They lived there until his death.






