

# Air Card For Scout Jamboree

In the Notes of April 3, it was suggested that a commemorative postal card be issued for the World Boy Scout Jamboree at Farragut State Park, Idaho. This was after the Post Office Department had given its decision not to release a stamp for the event. It was claimed that the Scouts had twice been the subject of a commem, and that it would be overdoing it to have another for them so soon.

It was further suggested that the postal card be similar to the attractive one which appeared for the SIPEX. Whether that format will be used remains to be seen.

The Post Office Department has wisely decided to "do something" for this outstanding session of Scouts—on page one is the announcement that the recognition will come in the form of a postal card in a denomination of 6c, the airmail rate for sending one to Canada and Mexico. For other destinations, stamps can be added.

The Department is to be commended for planning to have the card. A stamp would have been better, but do not consider the card as "something better than nothing". View it as something unusual which up to this time, I believe, the various postal administrations have never prepared for a Jamboree.

It also has the advantages of being a complete piece—no need to affix stamps, insert a stuffer as with a cover, or mail a prepared envelope off to a postmaster for service.

Should you want your FD cards returned to you through the mail, send along some adhesive labels (pressure sensitive recommended). Otherwise follow the directions of the news story. The labels are to have the name and address of the person to whom the cards are being sent.
