Covers Of British Stamp Booklets To Be Illustrated

Stamp books with illustrated covers — part of the Post Office's campaign to brighten-up its literature — began to replace the old books on March 25, it was recently announced by Britain's Postmaster General Edward Short, when he opened Stampex in London.

First to be available to the public was a cerise 10/- book, showing a portrait of David Livingstone from a wood engraving by David Gentleman. It will be on sale from post offices and at the philatelic counter in the London Chief Office, at Stampex, Central H all, Westminster, and by post or direct sale how the Philatelic Bureau in Editorial.

The new stamp books will show various aspects of Britain — he history, fauna and flora, her skill and crafts, and outstandin explorers, artists and inventors.

There will be three series of illustrations — depicting British explorers on the 10/- book, British birds on the 6/- (orange) book and British ships on the 4/6 (blue) book. Eminent artists have been commissioned for the illustrations and the layout and typography is the work of Stuart Rose, FSIA.

Designs for the 10/- book wil change every six months; the Livingstone cover will be suc ceeded by pictures of Scott, Mary

The pictorial books will be or general sale in post offices shortly after these dates. The designs will not be repeated and could well be come valuable as collector's pieces Their contents will remain the same, the covers retaining the present basic hues but in brighter more attractive shades.

Same FD For Most Recent Czech Five

Czechoslovakia released on March 25 five different commems marking as many different events. A little more than a month later, the nation will issue a pair for radio and television on April 29, and exactly one day later, April 30, the Olympics set of six will appear.

Those issued on March 25 marked, in order, Liptovsky Mikulas; the 150th anniversary of the National Museum in Prague; the 100th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of the National Theater in Prague; the 150th anniversary of the birth of Karl Marx; and the 20th anniversary of the World Health Organization.

The values of the first four lifferent commems are all 30h, while the fifth is 1Kcs. The designs n order show; architecture of a own and a portrait of Janko Kral he writer; an allegorical figure of woman; an allegory depicting a girl's head; a portrait of Karl Marx, and a microbiology motif.

Commem FD At Chicago; PA 12c At Greenfield Village On Inventor's Birth Anniversary

Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien has released the designs the Support Our Youth 6c commemorative postage stamp and the c Henry Ford definitive. The youth commen will be issued with first ty ceremonies May 1 at Chicago, during National Youth Week consored by the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks; the Ford egular July 30 at Greenfield Village, Mich.

In observance of its centennialthis year, the BPOE is extending ts youth service program. One activity will be a massive job hunt in some 2100 commúnities to incover summertime and parttime employment opportunities for young people.



During the month of April, Elks lodges throughout the country are surveying potential employers of young people and will prepare job

School principals available. School principals and guidance counselors will be asked to supply he names of students who most need employment to a u g m e n t family income.

This is in cooperation with President Johnson's Youth Opportunity program, which began in 1966 when more than a million jobs were found for 16-to-21-year-olds. When the President created the Council

on Youth Opportunity, which acts e under the direction of Vice President Humphrey, he said:

"Many youths, particularly those who live in impoverished areas, need special help in improving their lives and finding a place in the mainstream of our society ... the summer months provide an exceptional opportunity to enhance the sound growth and guidance of youth."

In addition to job opportunities for young people, there will be increased emphasis on educational and recreational programs for youth.

The stamp shows four young citizens — two girls and two boys — against a red, white and blue panel. Across the top of the design is "Support Our Youth", at the bottom is "United States Postage", both in blue. The denomination

"6C" is red. At vertical left of the horizontal stamp, also in blue, is "Elks 1868-1968". The four figures will be printed in blue.

The stamp was designed by Edward Vebell, of Westport, Conn. It was modeled by Leonard E. Buckley and Robert J. Jones, and engraved by Robert G. Culin (lettering) and Edward P. Archer (vignette) of the Bureau of (Continued on page 17)
