Japan Notes Girl Scouts; Adds Quasi-National Park

Two new issues have been reported for Japan. One appeared July 26 and commemorates a half century of the Japanese Girl Scouts; the other was the 33rd release in the quasi-national park series.

The Girl Scout issue was a 15 Yen picturing a Girl Scout. Designed by Takao Yamanouchi, it was photogravure printed in sheets of 20 subjects; printing total was 21 million copies.

The park issue consists of two 15Y denominations noting the Noto-Hanto quasi-national park. One of the values pictures the Kinoura Coast and a "goshinjitaiko" (a festival drum), while the other pictures the Mountain range of Tate-yama as seen from the Himi coast.

The designer was Minoru Hisano; printing was

photogravure in sheets of 20 subjects. Printing totals are 20 million copies each.

The park lies extending over the coastal area encircling the Noto Peninsula in the middle

part of North Japan. On the park's west are rocky cliffs, while the east includes the two Bays of Toyama and Nanao. It was designated a park on May 1,
