THE NASHVILLE PHILATELIC SOCIETY - ( a brief history )

The mission of the Nashville Philatelic Society is the stimulation of greater interest in, and fostering of all aspects which promote the hobby of stamp collecting. It was for this purpose that the society was formed in 1886. After 2 years interest waned and the society became inactive until revived in 1928. The society is a chapter of the American Philatelic Society.

The society was inactive from mid-December 1941 until after the end of World War II. The next 30 odd years were routine in nature until 1977 when the society created a reenactment of the Buffalo Balloon Flight of June 18, 1877. For this celebration a balloon was flown from Metro Center Nashville to Madison, Tennessee. The modern balloon carried letters franked with copies of the original semi-official balloon stamp ( Scott # CL1). The Society offered many philatelic souvenirs and gained national publicity through this noteworthy event.

In 1980 the society created another exciting event: The Pioneer Run, held in conjunction with Century III; Nashville's year long bi-centennial. On May 10, 1980, Pioneer Run Day, letters and cachets were sent by the "Captain Ann" packet boat up the Cumberland River to the Old Williamson Ferry Landing (McGavock Pike) where they were forwarded to the Donelson Post Office by "Pony Express" riders, thence by "Overland Express" (covered wagon) to the Hermitage; home of President Andrew Jackson. Here, the mail, local to this point, was turned over to USPS for final delivery.

1986 was a year of joyous celebration for the society, as it was 100 years old. The theme of Nashpex'86 was that celebration. The special event at Nashpex'86 was the banquet at which opening remarks were given by Keith Wagner, Executive Director of the American Philatelic Society. The guest speaker at the banquet was Michael Laurence, editor and publisher of Linn's Stamp News. One exhibit is worth a special mention: That by our club member, Jeanette Rudy. This exhibit was titled, "From Nashville With Love". It had Nashville cancellations from stampless to 1917. Mrs. Rudy won the following awards: the novice award, theme award, and Grand Award for the best exhibit at Nashpex'86.

The mission of the society remains the same today. The Society meets twice monthly (2nd and 4th Mondays) at the Inglewood Public Library at 7:00p.m. A philatelic program is planned for the second Monday and an auction is usually held on the fourth Monday. Interested persons may contact any society officer or member for further information about membership.

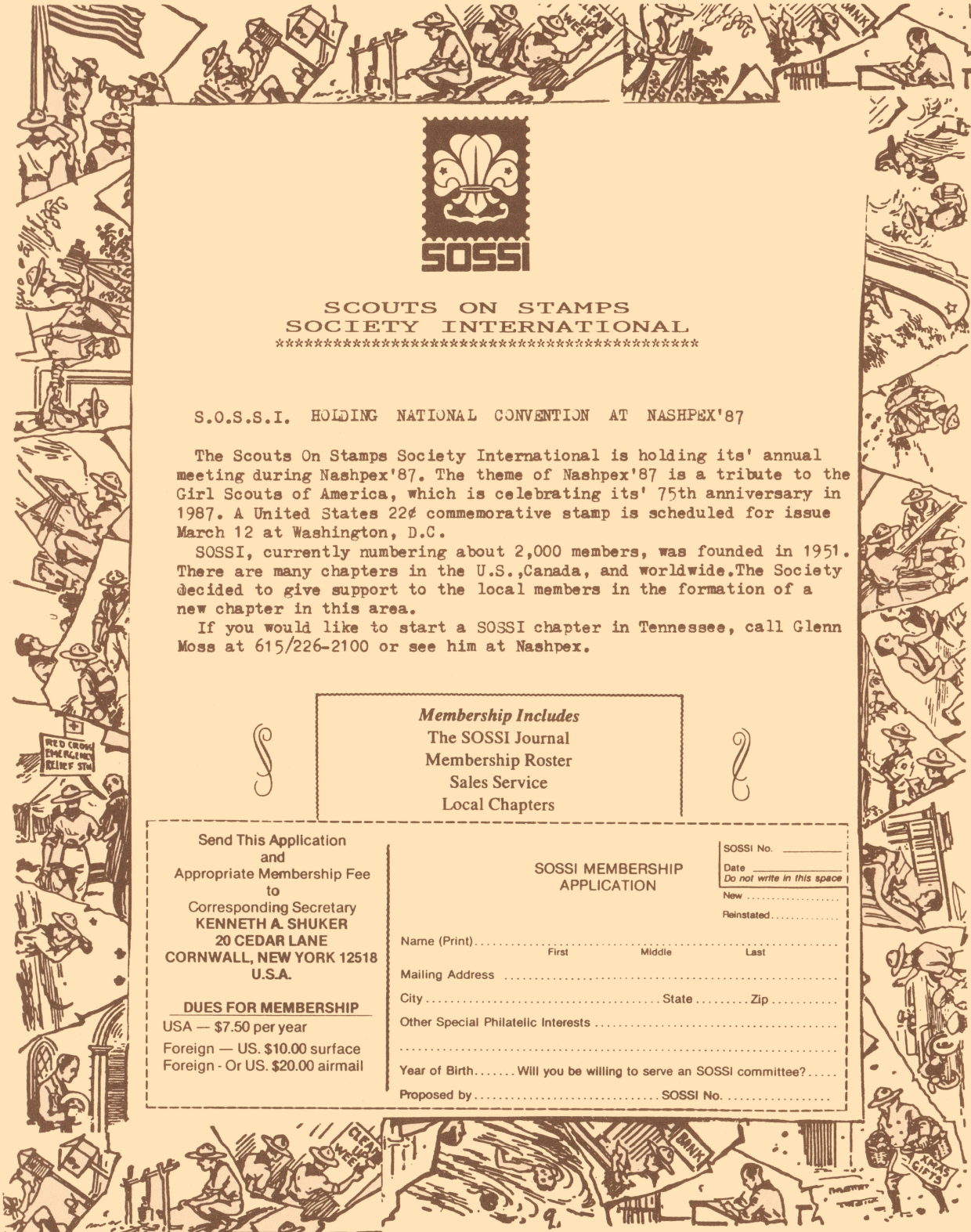

## NASHPEX '87 Show Program Note:

The actual 12 page program was printed on 8½ x 11 inch paper which when folded in half resulted in a 5½ x 8½ inch finished product. The page content had apparently been prepared on full size paper and significantly reduced to fit the production size. This resulted in very tiny text, less than 2 millimeters in height. The SOSSI Webmaster has enlarged the page width and scaled up the magnification in this Adobe Portable Document Format (.pdf) version in the hope that it will increase the readability.
