EMERSON A. CLARK, 1920-1988

SCOUTS ON STAMPS SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL

Since 1900, about 200 countries have issued postage stamps honoring Scouting. These Scout issues have been of special interest to many stamp collectors, particularly those who may have been or still are affiliated with the Scouting movement as a Scout or in some leadership capacity. The award-winning 7th edition of Howard J. Kaplan and William E. Hoffman's book, "Scouts on Stamps of the World", lists these stamps and is considered the most complete and authentic source of information on Scouts on Stamps by collectors in this country and abroad.

The Scouts on Stamps Society was established in Illinois in 1951 by Harry Thorsen, Jr. The primary purpose of the organization was to provide its members with the latest information on Scout stamp issues — Boy Scout or Girl Scout, past and present. This information was and is compiled from postal authorities and correspondents in all parts of the world and is now made available to members through the monthly SOSSI Journal.

Two years prior to organizing, Thorsen published the first writing about Scouts on stamps — a 32-page booklet called "Boy Scout Stamps of the World." At that time, there were only about 83 different stamps which could be considered part of a Scout collection.

The first <u>SOS Journal</u> was issued in March, 1952; the first meeting of the Chicago-area members was held in Thorsen's Winnetka home that November. This group became Baden-Powell Chapter 1 in 1954.

In 1956, the group's name expanded to Scouts on Stamps Society International, creating the familiar acronym "SOSSI." By 1987, the Society had approximately 6,100 collectors in its ranks, with 1,600 active members in 42 different countries.

Southern California's SOSSI Sunset Trails Chapter 10 was founded on June 24, 1961 by Aaron H. Lipman, David Meizner, Ken Green and Edward Kaufman. From 1965 to 1975 the Chapter sponsored SUNTRAPEX in the Los Angeles area. There were five classifications on display: Scouts on Stamps, Scout F.D.C.s and Cachets, Scout Patches and Insignia, Scout Memorabilia, and Juniors. This was a popular show, and in time it was merged with Sports philately.

Over the years, the Chapter has been active in manning a club table at the annual SESCAL shows, running a SOSSI table at the Los Angeles Council Campo-Rees, and providing and maintaining a display of Girl Scouts/Girl Guides on Stamps for Girl Scout Headquarters.

The Sunset Trails Chapter 10 meets bi-monthly in various members' homes in the Southern California area.
